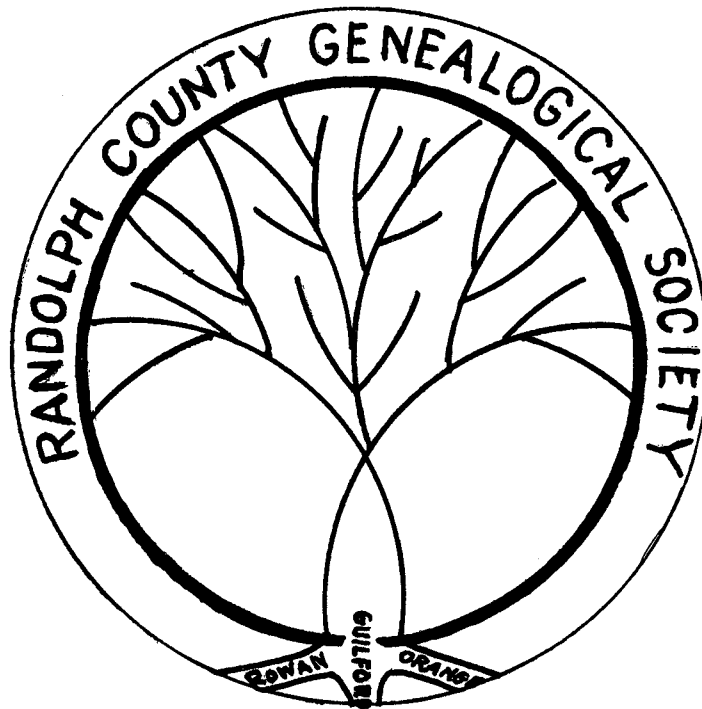

THAMER SAVES PASQUOTANK COUNTY RECORDS  
AND EARNS HER FREEDOM

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The following papers were found among the loose papers from the old vault in the Randolph County Court House. The originals are now in the North Carolina Archives.

They are most interesting due to the fact that the burning Smoke House contained the papers of the Pasquotank Registers Office.

SUNDREY PAPERS RELATIVE TO THE LIBERATION OF NEGRO TAMER.

The Deposition of Thomas JORDAN an Inhabitant of Pasquotank County, No. Carolina taken before William LANE, Esqr., one of the Justices of the Peace for said County.

Who deposeth and saith (on his solem affirmation that about the first of the Year 1790, the Smoke House of the said Thomas JORDAN was discovered in the dead time of Night to be dangerously on fire in which house he had considerable amount of property over and above what is usual, said Smoke House standing about the distance of thirty-five feet from his dwelling House in which was deposited or kept the Register's Office of said County as well as property in obligation to the amount of SEVERAL Thousand pounds besides his Household furniture - and that on alarming the Kitchen (which also was a large building with Sundry Rooms occupied to Sundry uses and Containing Considerable of valuable property, which house stood nearer the Smoke House than the Dwelling House) Several Negroes which the said JORDAN had then under his care came out to his assistance who in a most Extraordinary and indeed unexpectedly to him extinguished the fire notwithstanding it had so far prevaield as to break quite through the roof, that among those Negroes, Thamar formerly the property of Thomas NICHOLSON of Perquimans, deceased, distinguished herself by her Exertions to extinguish the dangerous Element in a most Extra-ordinary Manner and that her Conduct therein appears to him to be highly meritourious - and further this deponent saith not.

22 December 1797 the above deposition was duly affirmed to before me  
Wm. LANE, J. P.

The deposition of Christopher NICHOLSON an Inhabitant of Pasquotank County, No. Carolina taken before William LANE, Esqr., one of the Justices of said County.

Who on his solem affirmation deposeth and saith that about the first of the year 1790 he was present and assisted at the Extinguishing the fire at the time that the Smoke House of Thomas JORDAN caught fire, and that a Certain Negro woman formerly the property of Thomas NICHOLSON, deceased, by name Thamer was also present and Exerted herself in the

Extinguishing the same and that he believes that the Extinguishing thereof was in a good measure owing to her Efforts and that her Conduct appeared to him to be very meritorious and further this deponent saith not.

29 December 1797 the above Depossession was Duly affirmed to before me,

This Indenture made this 17th day of July in the year of our Lord 1805 Between Mary RAINS of the County of Union & State of So. Carolina, & Thomas GRAHAM of Stokes County, & Alexr. GRAHAM of Randolph Co. & John GRAHAM of Buncombe County & John GRAHAM of Randolph County & Joab RAINS of Randolph County & John WOODWARD & Hannah his wife of Randolph County, all of the State of No. Carolina of the one part & Richard GRAHAM of the County of Randolph & State of No. Carolina of the other part Witnesseth that the sd. Mary RAINS &c. for consideration of the sum of one Hundred & Seventy one Dollars Separately to them in hand paid by the sd. Richard GRAHAM at or before the Sealing & Delivery here of the receipt whereof they do hereby Acknowledge & hereby doth hereby Exonerate & Discharge the sd. Richard GRAHAM his heirs Exrs. & Admrs. by these presents have granted Bargained Sold and Confirmed unto the sd. Richard GRAHAM his Heirs & assignes forever all their Right title & Claim of in & to a Certain tract or parcel of land lying & Being in the County of Randolph & State of No. Carolina (on) Reed Creek joining Joseph LANE'S land belonging to the Estate of Richard GRAHAM Deceased, containing Two Hundred & Seventy four acres Together with all Singular the Rights Liberty Privlidges Improvements etc...therento Belonging unto the sd. Richard GRAHAM his Heirs & assigns forever & the sd. Mary RAINS & others &c. for themselves their Heirs & assigns forever do warrent & forever defend the aforesaid premeses ...unto the sd. Richard GRAHAM.

August Term 1807 - The Execution of the within Deed was duly Proved in open Court by Samuel ALLEN & ordered to be Registered. J. HARPER C.C.

ANTHONY RAINS

The following family records were found in the Revolutionary War pension papers of Anthony RAINS. He entered service in March, 1781 in Randolph County, and made application for pension, 5 February 1834, and stated he was then 77 years of age.

"This affiant states that he was born in the year 1757. That he has a record of his age made in his fathers family Bible which he now has in his possession. That he was born in Caroline County on the Rappahanock, in the State of Virginia, where he lived until he was 15 years of age at which time he moved with his mother and her family (his father being dead) into the County of Randolph, North Carolina, where he resided when he was called into the service and where he has continued to reside since that time.

"He states he is well known to the Rev. Lane HUTSON and Peter CRAVEN. Peter CRAVEN occasionally saw him in service."

(Signed) Anthony (x) RAINS

Randolph County, North Carolina. We, Lane HUTSON, a Clergyman residing in Randolph County and Peter CRAVEN know Anthony RAINS, believe him to be 77 years of age. (The said CRAVEN having seen him in actual service during the war.)

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State of Tennessee  
Perry County

On the 13th day of October 1840 came before me Aaron LOWE, an acting J. P. for the county of Perry, Mrs. Nancy RAINS, originally of the State of North Carolina and county of Randolph, now a resident of the State of Tennessee and county of Perry, aged 80 years the 10th day of July last. That she is the widow of Anthony RAINS, of the state of North Carolina who was a pensioner of the U. S.

She further declares that she was married to the said Anthony RAINS on the 2nd. day of March 1787 in the State of North Carolina, county of Randolph and that her husband the aforesaid Anthony RAINS, died in the county of Randolph on the 25th day of March 1837...

Personally appeared before me, Aaron LOWE, J. P. for the county of Perry, Mrs. Sarah GRAHAM originally a resident of the State of North

Carolina and county of Randolph, now a resident of the county of Perry, aged 69 years. She says the marriage of Anthony RAINS and Nancy GRAHAM, the sister of her husband John GRAHAM, took place in the State of North Carolina and county of Randolph on the 2nd. day of March 1787. The reason why deponent has a knowledge of the time when said marriage took place, in consequence of having a through knowledge of the births and ages of the children of the aforesaid Anthony RAINS and his wife Nancy, having been intimately acquainted with them for the term of 53 years or more.

Personally appeared Aaron HAMMER of said state and county, that he wrote the pages purporting to be the ages of the children of Anthony RAINS and Nancy, his wife, that he has known the aforesaid Anthony RAINS and Nancy his wife for the term of 50 years past, having been raised in the same neighborhood in Randolph County, North Carolina.

An inquisition indented and taken at a place known as the William ALLRED place, owned by Claiborne ALLRED, in the County aforesaid the 16th day of Sept. 1863, before me Alfred PIKE, Special Coroner of the said County upon the view of the body of (supposed to be) D. F. CAUDLE, late of Yadkin County, North Carolina, then and there lying dead and upon the oath of George MAKEPEACE, W. H. BURGESS, W. H. BROWNN, Lee ELDER, John THOMPSON, Nathan M. COX, Nathan COX, W. A. BROWN, M. N. BROWER, A. C. JONES, W. C. BRAY and Clark MILLIKAN good and lawful men of said County of Randolph, who being charged and sworn to inquire how and in what manner the said D. F. CAUDLE by his death came, and upon their oath do say that on the 15 day of Sept. A. D. 1863 the afore said D. F. CAUDLE sickened and died from exposure.

CIVIL WAR DIARY

PART II

June 20, 1864-

In camp resting and turned over our large tents and drew shelter tents.

June 21, 1864-

Broke up camp and again started upon our journey traveled until about noon, stopped for dinner and again started, traveled until near night, camped. Distance traveled 18 miles.

June 22, 1864-

Broke up camp and traveled until noon, took dinner, and started passed the rebel earthworks and Lookout Mountain. Went into camp 2 miles from Chata-nooga, traveled 11 miles.

June 23, 1864-

In camp. In good health. Detailed to clean up muskets. Weather very warm.

June 24, 1864-

Still in camp. In good health. Very warm weather. Eat dinner then went upon Lookout Mountain with eight of Co. F. Me and Mr. HALL got our likenesses taken on the top of the mountain both on one plate. There we saw the greatest scenery we ever beheld in life. Eat some huckleberries. Passed by the flagpole, went through and came down to camp again. Weather very warm.

June 25, 1864-

In good health. The weather extremely warm. I went upon the mountain on the top of the breastworks and there beheld one of the greatest scenes ever beheld. Saw the city of Chatanooga and the camps of about six thousand troops and Mission Ridge and about four miles of the Tennessee River. Gathered one quart of huckleberries besides what I eat. Brought them to camp now expecting a fine mess of them tomorrow. Went to town this evening.

June 26, 1864-

Sunday. In good health. Went huckleberry hunting. Gathered half gallon. Was out in hard rain, came to camp, got dinner went in the \*saltpeter cave about 2½ miles, came back to camp, got supper, then we had a meeting by a "Big Boy."

June 27, 1864-

In good health. Went huckleberry hunting. Gathered a half gallon of huckleberries and sold them for 50 cents.

\*There was a large cavern in the Sand Mountains, Tennessee. It was known as Black Tom Cave since a black man named Tom, in November 1863, lead an exploring party including four men of General HOOKER's into the cave. They had not returned four weeks later. A railroad ran several miles in to bring out dirt which was drained. The residue was liquid saltpeter. A big spring ran out of the cave located in the valley between Sand and Racoon Mountains.

June 28, 1864-

In good health. Went dewberry hunting. Gathered about two gallons, sold one quart for 20 cents, cooked the others and made a fine mess.

June 29, 1864-

In good health. Wrote two letters, one to brother Michael, one to my wife. Then went blackberry hunting. Gathered a bucket full, returned to camp. The company was moved inside of the picket lines and camped.

June 30, 1864-

In camp. In good health. Went a swimming in Tennessee River and came to camp, cooked half our berreis and had a large mess for four of us, myself, John, Abraham WALTERS, Andrew WALTERS. There came a very heavy rain while eating, turned over our muskets, drew rifles and mustered for pay.

July 1, 1864-

In good health. Went in swimming. Then went to town to get some paper and envelopes and a paper of tacks. Came to camp and half soled my boots.

July 2, 1864-

In good health. Washed mine and HADLEY's clothes. Went to the minstrel paid 25 cents for the sight.

July 3, 1864-

Broke up camp and marched four miles. Camped. Went on guard, a guarding the cattle.

Sunday Evening, July 4, 1864-

Came off guard at three A. M., got breakfast, broke up camp and started on our journey. Traveled through the Chicamauga Battle ground. Saw a man's head and feet a sticking out top of ground where he had been buried. Saw a number of rebel graves and the graves of 19 Union men. Traveled 8 miles. Stopped in Chicamauga Creek bottom at Lee and Gordon's Mill. For dinner hadhardtack and coffee, no meat. Rested 2½ hours, started again, marched 5 miles, stopped for the night. In good health but somewhat tired... Weather very warm camped in Georgia.

July 5, 1864-

Broke up camp and started on our journey, marched 7 miles and camped in Chicamauga River bottom and drew three day's rations at Ringgold. In good health. The weather very warm for driving cattle. We have twelve hundred head in drove.

July 6, 1864-

In good health. Broke up camp and started on our march. Drove 8 miles and stopped a Tunnel Hill Station for dinner. Herded cattle 3 hours then drove 5 miles and camped for the night. Very tired and fatigued. The weather very warm and dusty. Passed the Buzzard Roost and the "rebs" camp.

July 7, 1864-

In good health. Broke up camp and started on our march. Traveled through rebel's camps and fortifications all day. Stopped at Dalton, Georgia, for dinner. Rested 2 hours then started again. I was rear guard at night, traveled 10 miles. Very warm.

July 8, 1864-

In good health. Detained at camp until 8 o'clock waiting for the train of the Third Division of the Fifteenth Army Corps to pass, the 275th Infantry.

July 8, 1864- (Continued)

When passed we started on our journey, marched 6 miles. Stopped for dinner 3 hours then we drove through Resaca, crossed the river, went a half mile, stopped. We had a heavy rain. Sat under a cotton gin in time of this rain. Traveled 3½ miles since dinner and camped for the night.

July 9, 1864-

In good health. Broke up camp and started at 6 o'clock A. M., marched 2½ miles and stopped for to draw rations. Camped at the best spring I ever saw. It boiled up at two places as large as a churn. It would run a mile. Gathered a fine lot of berries. I had a juicy old mess or three of them.

July 10, 1864-

Still in camp Sunday resting. We had a good meeting. The Chaplain preached in the grove by the spring. I wrote a letter the 9th and 10th sent to my wife. My health is good today.

July 11, 1864-

In good health. On guard. Drove the cattle out 1½ miles to herd. Gathered about 2½ gallon of blackberries. Relieved at noon. Went to camp. Got dinner. Broke up camp. Marched 3 miles camped at a large spring to herd cattle. Rained at 12 o'clock.

July 12, 1864-

In good health. Wrote a letter to my wife. Then at 1 o'clock struck tents and marched 2½ miles and camped. Had a heavy rain and got very wet. Camped near Calhoun, Georgia.

July 13, 1863-

In good health except a pain in my back. Lay wet all night. Teams gone to Resaca to draw rations. Weather hot.

July 14, 1864-

Still in camp near Calhoun, Georgia. In good health.

July 15, 1864-

In good health on picket guard.

July 16, 1864-

Still in camp. in moderate health. Weather very hot.

July 17, 1864-

In good health. Struck tents and started on our march. Traveled about 10 miles and stopped and camped for the night at Adairsville, Georgia. The train run over a soldier's neck, killed him instantly. Then that night the train ran off of the track, killed 1 soldier, seriously wounded 16 others.

July 18, 1864-

In good health. Broke up camp and started on our march at 5 o'clock A. M. Marched to Kingston, passed through, traveled 3 miles and camped. Distance traveled this day 13 miles. The teams gone to Kingston to draw rations.

July 19, 1864-

Sick at the stomach and running off of the bowels. Pulled up stakes and started at 4 A. M. Passed through Cass Station and Cartersville, then to Etowah Station and Etowah River. Camped in the river bottom. Distance traveled 9 miles.

July 20, 1864-

Not very well, sick at the stomach all night. Struck tents and started on our march at half past 4 A. M. and marched to Altoona 6 miles. Stopped for dinner on the Altoona Mountain then marched 1 mile for feed for the cattle. Camped, waiting orders to move on with cattle.

July 21, 1864-

In moderate health. Struck tents and started on our march at 2 P.M. Passed through Acworth, Georgia. Marched 5 miles. Had a heavy rain before we got to camp. Drew rations before we left.

July 22, 1864-

In common health. Struck tents and started on our march at 4 P.M. Marched over the Kennesaw cattle ground and passed Kennesaw Mountains. I marched through Marietta and camped for the day. My legs are very tired. distance marched 15 miles. Heard heavy cannonading in the direction of Atlanta late this evening.

July 23, 1864-

In good health. Struck tents and started on our march. Traveled 10 miles and camped in Chattahoochee River bottom. Heard heavy cannonading in the direction of Atlanta from 7 A.M. until 3 P.M. It was all on our right wing. It was kept up all night. I was on guard.

July 24, 1864-

In good health. Was relieved from guard at half past five and started on our march. Marched 5 miles down the Chattahoochee River to the pontoon bridge and camped for the day. Heavy cannonading on our right all day. There was 1160 prisoners passed by here in one squad and 700 in the next squad. Cannonading all night on our right wing.

July 25, 1864-

Still in camp at the pontoon bridge on the Chattahoochee River. The fire is still kept up this morning. Some cannonading on the left of our center. We issued out all of our cattle. I think I will join our regiment this evening. This is a list of my travels since I joined the 23rd Missouri Volunteers up to July 25, 1864, from the first of September 1862. Keep this book my loved ones until I return home to you and if I never should return, give each one a copy of this in remembrance of me as your husband and father. I love you all dearly and if we never meet again on earth I hope to meet you all in Heaven where parting is no more. If I fall in battle I trust it will be the Lord's will. Farewell my loved ones Farewell, lie in peace. The Lord will bless.

NOTE: No attempt has been made to prove parentage of Revel STAFFORD.

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Revel STAFFORD married Jane SKEAN, daughter of Jacob SKEEN. No marriage bond has been found, but proof of the marriage is found in the following Randolph County Deed Abstracts.

Deed book 6, page 45 dated 25 Dec. 1794 - Jonathan PARKER of Guilford County sold Revel STAFFORD of Randolph County,  $\frac{1}{2}$  of a tract for £125, which was formerly the property of Jacob SKEEN and sold to Jane SKEEN the daughter of the said Jacob, a parcel Jonathan PARKER purchased from Revel STAFFORD beg. at the head of the Mill Race on Deep River to near the Mill House.

Deed book 8, page 402 dated 29 Sept. 1795 - Revel STAFFORD and his wife Jane, formerly Jane SKEAN, daughter of Jacob SKEAN, all of Randolph County, to George MENDENHALL of Guilford County for £500, 400a. formerly the property of Jacob SKEEN and sold by Aaron HILL, Sheriff, to Jane SKEAN, said daughter of Jacob SKEEN. Land lying on the waters of Deep River.

Deed book 8, page 155 dated 20 May 1800 - John SLONE of Roan County, to Revel STAFFORD of Randolph County, for \$100., 200a. on Toms Creek and Uharee River waters adj. SKEAN, to a pine marked J. S. and McCULLOCHS line. Proved May 1800 by John SKEAN.

He appears on Capt. SHAW'S list of taxables for the year 1820 with 290a. adjoining Kid CRANFORD.

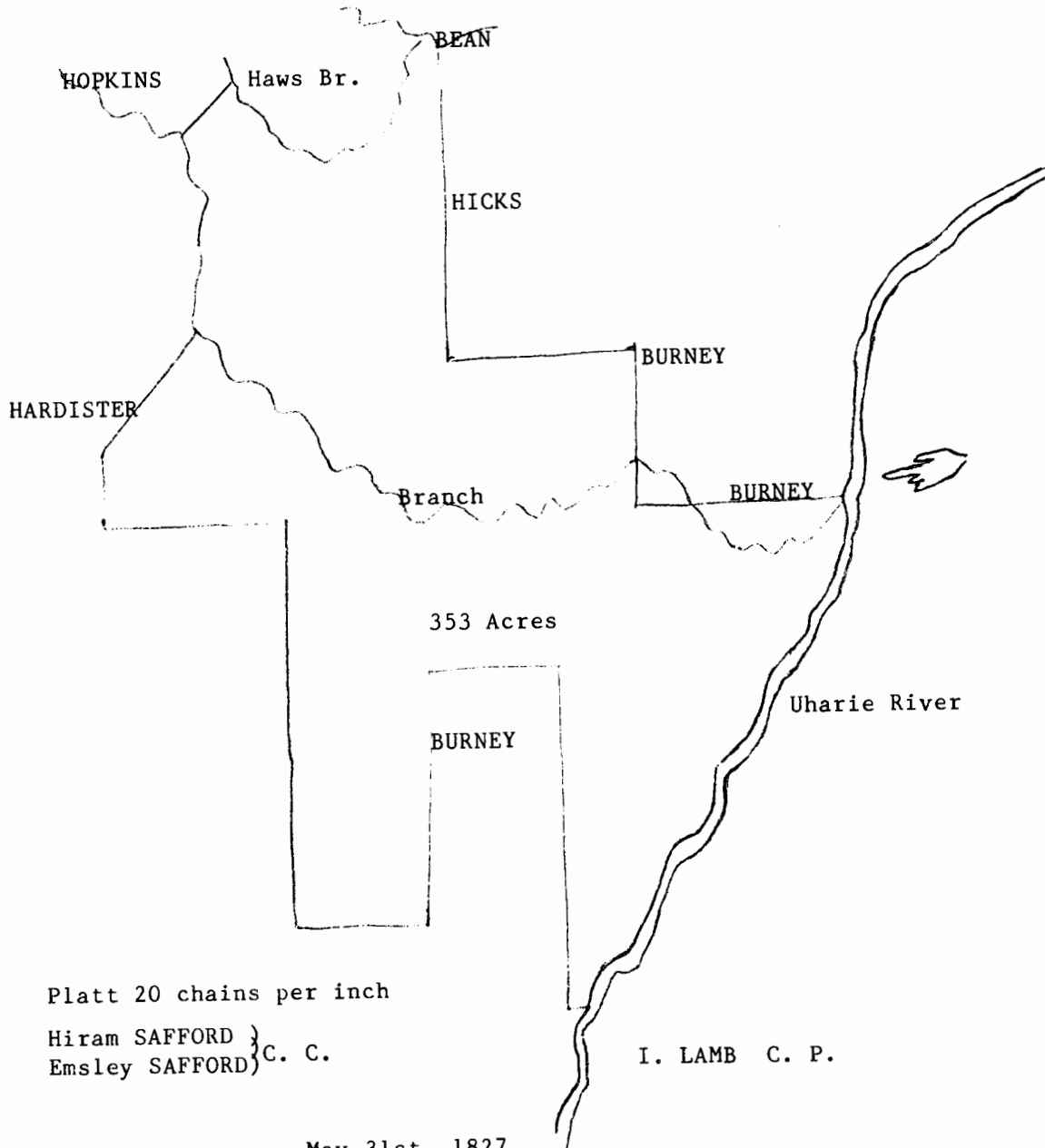
Revel and Jane STAFFORD lived on the Uharee River near the Montgomery County line. In 1827 he gave notice to his neighbors that he was to have his lands resurveyed. All the notices were not found, as he states the land is on both sides of the river. The platt (on the following page) shows the land on the west side of the river, and calls for boundaries of BEAN, HOPKINS, HARDISTER, HICKS and BURNEY. The other procession notices would bound the land on the east side of the river.

The notices found were to Thomas HARDESTER, John HALL, Samuel CRANFORD, Richard CRANFORD and Davis HIX, Senr., all read the same. "I hereby give you notice that on Thursday the 31st day of May, I intend to have the lands where I now live lying on both sides of Uharee adjoining

The said Thomas C. LUTTERLOH was last paid by Paymaster J. B. BURTON at Weir Bottom Church, Virginia June 20th 1862 including the 1st day of May eighteen hundred and sixty two and has pay due from that time to the present date.

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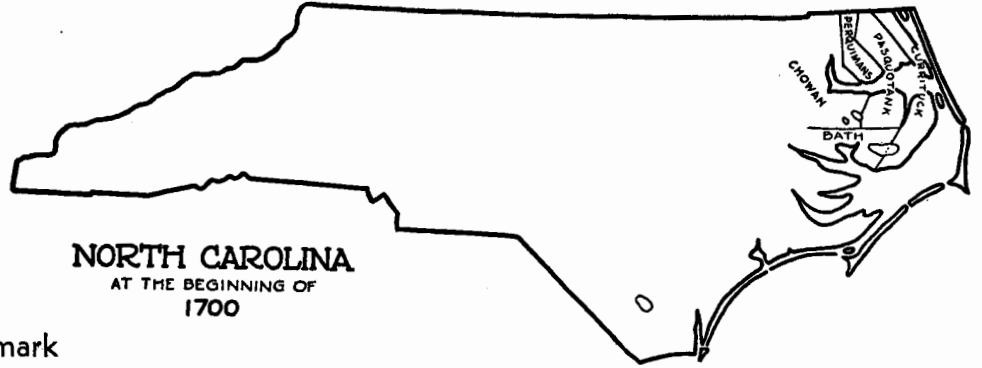
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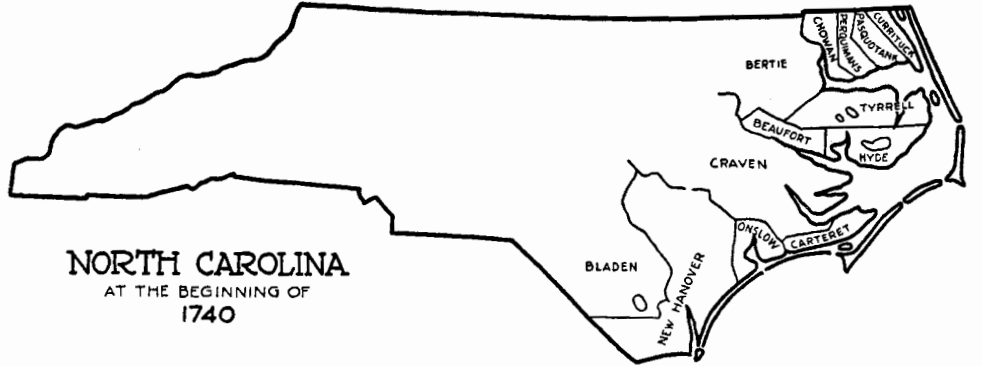

 Showing Approximate County Divisions within Present State Boundaries

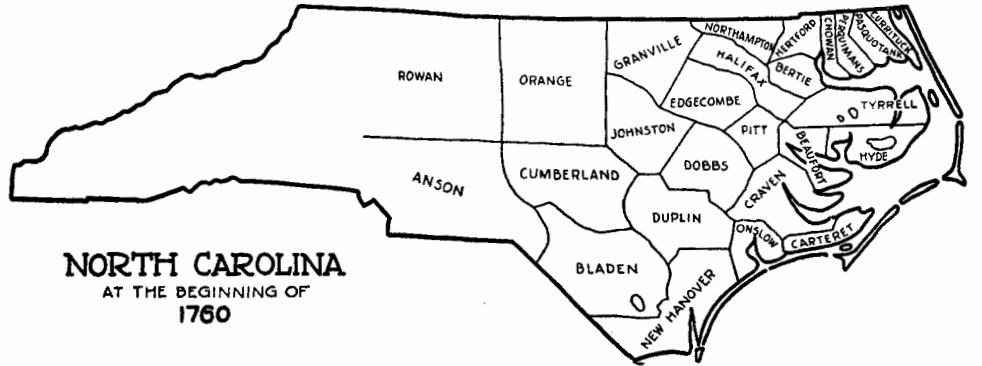

 1700

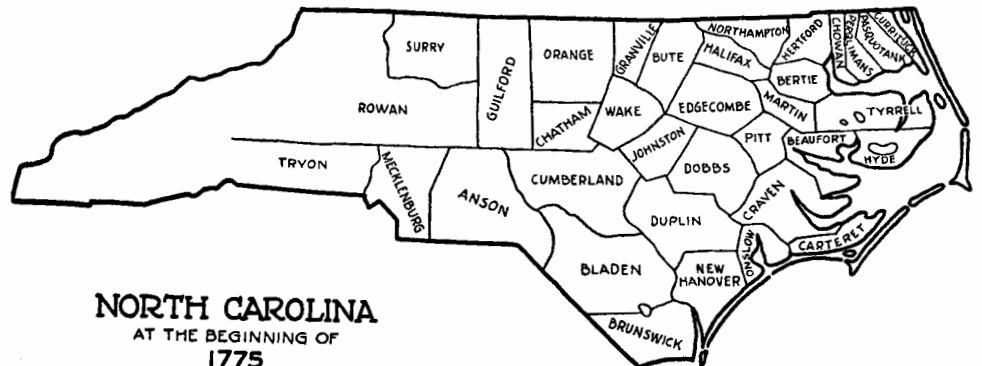

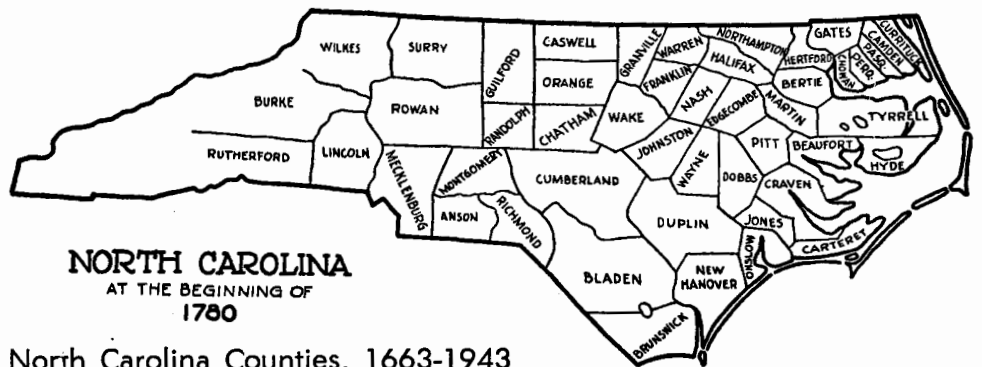
**NORTH CAROLINA**
